## INSPECTION TARGETING PLAN AND EMPHASIS PROGRAMS Updated 07/18/2017

Enforcement of safety and health regulations is Nevada OSHA's primary tool to help provide safe and healthful working conditions for every worker in the state. An effective process for selecting establishments for programmed inspections is key to achieving this—and Nevada OSHA intends to achieve this with its Inspection Targeting Plan and Emphasis Programs.

Nevada OSHA will primarily focus its programmed inspections in the following areas as part of its strategic plan:

- 1. Construction Industry
- 2. Manufacturing Industry
  - a. Wood Product Manufacturing (NAICS 321xxx)
  - b. Fabricated Metal Manufacturing (NAICS 332xxx)
  - c. Plastics and Rubber Manufacturing (NAICS 326xxx)
  - d. Food Manufacturing (NAICS 311xxx)

Additionally, the agency also selected the following industries for inspections under its Local Emphasis Programs:

- 1. Hotels (NAICS 721110)
- 2. Casino-Hotels (NAICS 721120)
- 3. General Auto Repair (NAICS 81111)
- 4. Automotive Body, Paint, and Interior Repair and Maintenance (NAICS 811121)
- 5. Linen Supply (NAICS 812331)
- 6. Industrial Launderers (NAICS 812332)
- 7. Shooting Ranges
- 8. Scaffolding
